

# 1.1 Keys and connectors





# <

# Back button

 Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.

# Home button

- · From any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.
- Touch and hold to open Google Assistant. You can get help such as getting directions and restaurant information based on the content detected on the screen.

#### Recent apps

· Touch to view applications you've recently accessed.

# Power key

- · Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
  - Note: Additional shortcuts and customizable settings are available at Settings > Button & gestures > Power key.
- Press and hold: Show the popup menu to select from Power off/Restart/ Airplane mode.
- Press the Power key and Volume down key at the same time to take a screenshot.
- Press and hold the Power key for at least 10 seconds to force reboot.
- Press to turn on screen

#### Volume Keys

- . In call mode, adjusts the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjusts the media volume.
- In general mode, adjusts the media volume.
- Mutes the ringtone of an incoming call.
- In camera preview mode, press the Volume up or Down key to take a photo or press and hold to take burst shots. To set, touch Camera > Settings > Volume button function


# 1.2 Getting started

#### 1.2.1 Set up

#### Installing or removing the SIM card and microSD™ card

Your phone already has a SIM card installed. If you need to change or remove your SIM card, follow the steps below.

- 1. Use the provided SIM pin to open the SIM tray.
- To install SIM/microSD™ card, place the SIM/microSD™ card with the chip facing down into the SIM card tray and then slide it into its slot.
- 3. To remove SIM/microSDTM card, push up on the chip side of the cards inside the SIM tray.



You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. You do not need to power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card as this phone supports hot swap.



Your phone only supports nano-SIM cards. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types; otherwise this may cause damage to your phone.

#### Charging the battery



You are advised to fully charge the battery ( ). Charging status is indicated by a percentage displayed on screen while the phone is powered off. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste when the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running anglications when not in use: reduce the backlight time, etc.

# 1.2.2 Powering on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Swipe, PIN, Password, Pattern, Fingerprint or Face recognition) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or forget it, contact your network carrier. Be sure to keep your PIN code secure.

# 1.2.3 Powering off your phone

Press and hold the Power key until options appear, then select Power off.

# .3 Home Screen

You can bring all of the items that you use most frequently (applications, shortcuts, widgets, folders) to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** button to switch to the Home screen.



The Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view.

#### 1.3.1 Using the touchscreen





To access an application, touch it with your finger.



# Touch and hold

To enter the available options for an item, touch and hold the item. For example. Select a contact in Contacts and touch and hold it. An options list will then appear.





Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.



# Slide/Swipe

Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, and web pages. You can also slide the screen horizontally.





Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.



Place two fingers on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.





Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the device sideways to have a better view

#### 1.3.2 Status bar

From the status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).

Drag down the status bar to view notifications and drag again to enter the guick settings panel. Touch and drag up to close it.



Drag down the Status bar to open the Quick Settings panel or Notification panel. Drag up to close the panels.

#### **Notification panel**

When there are notifications, touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read more detailed information.



#### **Quick settings panel**

Touch and drag down from the top of the screen twice to open the Quick settings panel. You can enable or disable functions or chance modes by touching the icons.



# Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the screen with a Pattern, PIN, Password, registered Fingerprint or Face unlock  $^{(1)}$ .

To create a screen unlock, touch Settings > Security & biometrics > Screen lock.

<sup>(1)</sup> Fingerprint and Face unlock may not be as secure as Pattern, PIN, or Password locks.

#### To lock the phone screen

- If your phone remains inactive for a period of time, it will automatically lock the screen and enter sleep mode to save power. Go to Settings > Display > Sleep and select a screen timeout period.
  - You can also manually lock the screen by pressing the **Power** key once.

#### Swipe to unlock the screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, swipe up the screen to unlock the screen.



#### Enter a password to unlock the screen

Once the screen is turned on, swipe up the screen to display the password input panel. Then enter your lock screen password.

#### Use pattern unlock

Draw the same pattern you have set to unlock the screen.

#### Use Face unlock

- From the app list, touch Settings > Security & biometrics > Face unlock. Before using the face unlock, you need to set a pattern/PIN/password.
- Hold your phone 20-50 cm from your face, Position your face in the square shown on the screen, For best results, we suggest that the face key setup is completed indoors and away from direct sunlight.
- Enable Face unlock when your screen turns on, otherwise you will have to swipe up on the screen in order to unlock

#### Use Fingerprint unlock

- For the best result, begin with the index finger on your dominant hand.
- Put your finger on the sensor and lift after you feel a vibration. Keep lifting your finger to add the different parts of your fingerprint.
- Follow theses steps until fingerprints are fully registered.

#### 1.3.3 Personalizing your Home screen

#### hhΑ

You can touch and hold a folder, an application or a widget and drag the item to your preferred Home screen.

### Reposition

Touch and hold an item and drag it to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favorite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen

#### Remove

# Touch and hold the item and drag it up to the top of the remove icon, and release after it turns red.

#### Create folders

To improve the organization of shortcuts or applications on the Home screen and the Favorite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Customize by touching Settings > Home screen & lock screen > Lock screen shortcut.

#### Wallpaper customization

Touch and hold an empty area on the Home screen, then touch Wallpapers to customize wallpaper.

## 1.3.4 Widgets and recently used applications

# Widgets

Touch and hold the empty area in the Home screen, then touch Widgets to display all widgets.

Touch and hold the selected widget and slide it to move to your preferred screen.

#### Recently used applications

To consult recently used applications, touch the Recent apps key.

Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the application.



Touch one thumbnail and slide it up to close the application, slide it right/left to switch between the applications.

Touch at the bottom of the screen to close all the running applications.



Press the Volume key to adjust the Media volume.

Touch the vicon to adjust Ring, Alarm and Notification volume.

# 1.4.1 Using the Onscreen Keyboard

# **Onscreen Keyboard settings**

 $\label{thm:condition} \textbf{Touch Settings} > \textbf{System} > \textbf{Language \& input}, \ \text{touch the Virtual keyboard you want to set up and a series of settings will become available.}$ 

#### Adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation. You can adjust it by changing the settings (Touch on/off **Settings** > **Display** > **Auto-rotate screen**).

# 1.4.2 Android keyboard



- Enter recipient numbers or select from contacts
- Touch to send the message
- Touch to insert a period
  Touch and hold to select symbols
- 4 Touch to insert a comma Touch and hold to access keyboard settings, insert an emoji, or view input options.

- Touch to switch between "abc/Abc" mode
  Touch twice to switch to "ABC" mode

# 1.4.3 Text editing

#### You can edit text which you have entered.

- . Touch and hold or double tap within the text you want to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the amount of text to edit.
- The following options will appear: Cut, Copy, and Share.


#### You can also insert new texts if preferred


- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold a blank area. The cursor will blink and the tab will appear. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have cut or copied any text, touch the tab to show the Paste and Select all option which allows you to complete pasting immediately.



# Phone, Call log and Contacts.....







Enter the desired number from the dial pad and touch to place the call or select a contact from Contacts or Call logs by sliding or touching tabs, then make the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching **Create new contact** or **Add to a contact**.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching 🗶

To hang up a call, touch

#### International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and touch

#### **Emergency call**

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and touch emergency call. Depending on your network and country this could even work without a SIM card and without voin in the SIM PIN code.

## 2.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call





# When you receive a call:

- Press ANSWER, or swipe up the icon \( b \) to answer;
- Press DECLINE, or swipe down the icon \( \mathbb{\mod}\mod}\mathbb{\mathb

## 2.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, touch and hold  $\frac{1}{20}$ .

If you receive a voicemail, appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel and touch New voicemail.

# 2.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume up/down key.











Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.

Make another call.

Put a call on hold.

Merge calls to start a conference call.

Swap the calls.

To avoid accidental operation of the touchscreen during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put the cellphone close to your ear and it will be unlocked when the cellphone is taken away from your ear.

# 2.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

# Swap calls

When you accept two calls, touch the \( \frac{1}{2} \) icon to switch between two lines. The current call will be put on hold and you are able to join the other call.

#### Conference calls(1)

You can set up a conference call as follows.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch to add another call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to the conference and touch can also add participants from Call logs or Contacts.
- Touch  $\uparrow$  to start the conference.
- Touch to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

# 2.1.6 Call settings

● Touch ● from the **Phone** screen, then touch **Settings** to set phone and contact settings.

# 2.1.7 Call log

You can access your call logs by touching from the **Phone** screen to view missed calls, outgoing calls and incoming calls.

Touch one call to view information or further operations. You can launch a new call, send a message to the contact or number, or view detailed information of the call.

To delete the call history of a selected contact or number, touch and hold the contact and choose Delete.

# 2.2 Contacts .....



Contacts enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronize these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

## 2.2.1 Consult your Contacts

To see your contacts, touch from the App drawer.






Deleted contacts will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronize your phone.

Depending on your network carrier.

## 2.2.2 Adding a contact

Touch • in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another.



#### Add to/remove from Favorites (1)

To add a contact to favorites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch  $\bigstar$  to add the contact to favorites.

To remove a contact from favorites, touch 🖈 on the contact details screen.

# 2.2.3 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch in the contact details screen. When finished, touch Save.

# 2.2.4 Using the Quick contact panel

Touch a contact to open the Quick contact panel.



- Touch or the number to make a call.
- Touch to send a message.

The icons available on the Quick contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your phone.

Phone and Gmail contacts can be added to favorites.

## 2.2.5 Sharing contacts

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

- From the Contacts screen, touch and hold a contact and touch
- Select the application to perform this action.

#### 2.2.6 Accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch from the contacts list and touch Settings > Accounts > Add account, or from the home screen, touch Settings > Accounts > Add account.

You are required to select the type of account you are adding, like Google, etc.

As with any other account setup, you need to enter detailed information, such as username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. Touch the account you want to delete, touch **Remove account**, then confirm.

#### Auto-sync

On the **Accounts** screen, turn on **Automatically sync data**. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronized with each other.

# Messages .....



# 3.1 Writing a new message

You can create, edit, send and receive SMS and MMS with this phone.

To access Messages, touch from the App drawer.

On the message list screen, touch Start chart to write text/multimedia messages.





#### Sending a text message

- To add recipients, enter a mobile phone number or select a contact in the To bar.
- Touch the Text message bar to enter the text of the message.
- When finished, touch send the text message.



Specific letters (accented) will also increase the size of the SMS. This may cause multiple

# Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, and sounds to other compatible mobile devices and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses are added.


- To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the To bar.
- Write the text of the message in the Text message bar.
- Touch (+) to attach a picture, video, audio, etc.
- When finished, touch to send the multimedia message.

#### 3.2 Manage messages

When receiving a message, will appear on the Status bar as a notification. Drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel. Touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messages application and touch the message to open it.

Messages are displayed as a conversation.

Touch a message to enter the message composing screen:



- Touch for more options
- Touch to video call the number
- Touch to call the number
- Touch to save the number to Contacts or view the contact details if the number has been saved

To adjust message settings, touch • and select **Settings** on the message list screen.

# Apps and Features.....

# 4.1 Camera.....



Before using the camera, make sure that you remove the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

## 4.1.1 Launch Camera

There are multiple ways to open the Camera app.


#### From the Home Screen

From the home screen, touch Camera



# From the Lock Screen

When the screen is locked, press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, then swipe left on the camera icon in the lower right corner to open the camera.



- Select filters
- Plash mode: Touch to turn on/off the camera flash

**WARNING:** Keep a safe distance when using the flash. Do not point the flash toward people's or animals' eyes.

- 3 Take a timed photo
- 4 Take HDR photos
- 5 Zoom in/out
- Turn on/off Ultra Wide mode.
- Switch between front/back camera
- Take a photo

- Touch to access settings
- 10 Picture size
- Pinch fingers together to zoom out, or spread fingers apart to zoom in
- 12 View the photos or videos you have taken

#### 4.1.2 To take a photo

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First, position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary. Touch to capture. The photo will be automatically saved. You can also touch and hold ( ) to take burst shots.

#### 4.1.3 To take a video

Touch VIDEO to change the camera mode to video.

Touch to start video recording. Touch the left part of this icon to take a picture during video recording.

Touch the right part of this icon • • • to pause video recording and touch • to continue.

Touch • to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

#### Further operations when viewing a photo/video you have taken

- Slide left or right to view the photos or videos you have taken.
- Touch 
  , then Gmail/Bluetooth/MMS/etc. to share the photo or video.
- Touch Back button 

   to return to Camera.

# 4.1.4 Modes and settings

#### Modes

Slide left or right to switch between modes.

- AUTO: Auto is the default mode for Camera.
- . VIDEO: Touch to access video mode.
- PORTRAIT: Touch to create a depth of field effect. You can compose an image that highlights your subject while producing a gorgeously blurred background.

- PRO: Pro camera mode lets you fine-tune parameters and gives you full control over ISO, WB
  exposure time, aperture, shutter speed and so on.
- PANO: Touch to turn on the panorama function. Touch the shutter button to start taking a panoramic
  photo and move the phone steadily along in the direction indicated by the onscreen line. Once the
  progress bar are filled, the photo will be automatically saved. If the progress bar is not fully filled,
  touch the shutter button again to save the photo.

Touch to access more modes. These modes can be moved to the main screen by touching



- STOP MOTION: Capture a number of photos of a certain scene, then convert them into a speededup video.
- LIGHT TRACE: Capture creative movements of light using a long exposure photograph.
- SUPER MACRO: Touch to access super macro mode. 1 to 3 inches is the best macro shooting distance.
- HIGH PIXEL: When capturing pictures the device will use the 50M rear camera or 16M front camera.
   The photos are larger and more detailed than pictures taken in auto mode. This mode works only in partially bright scenes, such as when the sun is shining.

#### Settings

Touch to set more options:

- Photo size: Touch to select photo size.
- Video quality: Touch to select video quality.
- Calorie detection: Turn on \_\_\_\_\_\_ to detect the calorie content of a captured object.
- Smart guideline: Touch to turn on/off. This feature provides Al-powered facial detection and composition guides for portrait shots. It only works when using the main camera.
- Volume button function: Touch to customize the Volume button to Shutter, Zoom or Volume when
  using camera.
- Storage: Touch to choose between phone and microSD™ card storage when an microSD™ card is inserted. The default is phone storage.
- Save location information: Turn on to tag photos and videos with your location. This option is available when the GPS location service is enabled.
- Shutter sound: Touch to turn on/off shutter sound when capturing.
- Watermark: Touch to turn on/off Watermark.
- Reset settings: Touch to reset the camera to its factory default settings.

More options are available when you switch to using the front camera:


- Face Beauty: Touch to turn on/off. When activated, touch (3) to adjust skin smoothing and enhance coloring effects in portraits.
- Mirror camera: Touch to turn on/off.

# 4.2 Gallery .....



Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and play videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for selection.

To view the photos you have taken, touch from the Home screen.




- 1 Tap to access more options
- **Explore:** Explore collects photos into groups making them more easy to find
- Albums: Photos, videos, screenshots, etc. are all automatically grouped in Albums
- 4 Moments: View the photos/videos you have just taken

# 4.2.1 Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as a contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Find the picture you want to work on, and touch the picture in the full-screen picture view.





- Touch to edit the picture.
- Select Filters.
  - Crop, Rotate or Mirror the picture.
- Draw the picture.
- Adjust the picture color.
- Touch to set Dehaze, Object eraser and Sky.
- Touch to set the picture as your favorite.
- Touch to delete the picture.
- Touch > Set as to set the picture as a Contact photo or Wallpaper.

## 4.2.2 Album management

When there are multiple pictures and videos, you can manage your albums for convenient viewing.

#### Create an album





Tap + to create and name a new album. Select the pictures or videos you want to include in it by tapping  $\checkmark$  to copy or move them.

# Move/copy pictures or videos

Touch and hold the picture(s) or video(s) you want to move/copy. Touch  $^{\bullet}_{\bullet}$  > Copy to album/Move to album, then select the album that you want to move to/copy to.

#### Delete or recover pictures or videos

Deleted items will be retained in the **Trash** album for 30 days, after which they will be permanently deleted. To permanently delete them within this period, find the picture(s) or video(s) in **Trash** and touch and hold to delete.

To recover the picture(s) or video(s) within this period, touch and hold the picture(s) or video(s) in **Trash** and touch to recover.

#### Hide album (1)

Touch and hold the album you want to hide, touch > MOVE. The album contents will be hidden from Moments

# 4.3 Calendar



Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To view the calendar and create events, open the Google apps folder from the Home screen, then touch Calendar.

#### 4.3.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar by Schedule, Day, 3 days, Week, or Month, touch \_\_\_\_ to select.

#### 4.3.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch 🕂 .
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can turn on All-day
- Invite guests to the event. Enter the email addresses of the guests you want to invite with commas
  to separate. The guests will receive an invitation from Calendar and Email.
- When finished, touch Save at the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from the Day, 3 days and Week view screens, touch an empty spot to select a target area, then touch again to create a new event.

### 4.3.3 To delete or edit an event

To delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter its details screen. Touch  $\int$  to edit the event, or touch  $\circ$  > **Delete** to delete.

#### 4.3.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon 31 will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the notification panel, touch an event name to view the Calendar notification list. Touch the **Back** button to keep the reminders pending in the Status bar and the notification panel.

# 4.4 Clock .....



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To view the current time, swipe up the Home screen, then touch  ${\it Clock}$ , or tap time on the Home screen to access it.

### 4.4.1 Alarm

From the Clock screen, touch Alarm to enter.

- Turn on to enable the alarm.
- Touch + to add a new alarm, touch 
  to save.
- Touch a currently existing alarm to enter the alarm editing screen.
- Touch DELETE and confirm to delete the selected alarm.

Default albums such as Camera, Videos, Screenshots, etc. can't be hidden or moved.

#### 4.4.2 Clock

To view the date and time, touch Clock.

Touch to add a city from the list.

# 4.4.3 Timer

From the Clock screen, touch Timer to enter.

- . Touch the provided time to start the countdown directly. Or
- Set the time. Touch to start the countdown.
- Touch II to pause.
- Touch to reset.

# 4.4.4 Stopwatch



This manual briefly introduces the apps. For detailed features and user guides, refer to the related websites or the introduction provided in the apps.

You are recommended to register with a Google Account to enjoy full functionality.



# Google

Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices on which the browser is installed can be synchronized with your Google Account.



# **Google Assistant**

Long press the **Home** button to quickly ask for help, check the news, make a phone call, and more.



# **Chrome**

A web browser with which you can surf the internet. Your bookmarks, browsing history, and settings across all devices with the browser installed can be synchronized with your Google Account.



# **Drive**

A file storage and synchronization service created by Google, which allows users to store files in the cloud, share and edit files. Files in Drive are kept secure and can be accessed from any device by logging in to your Google Account. Files or folders can be shared orivately with other Google Account users.



# Duo

A video chat mobile app. With phone numbers verified, users can easily video call people from their contact list.



# **Files**

Files displays all data stored on the phone, including both external microSD™ card and internal storage, such as applications, media files downloaded from Google Play Store, YouTube or other locations; Videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth. USB cable, etc.



# **Gmail**

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. With this application you can send and receive emails, manage emails by labels, archive emails, etc. Emails can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account.



# **Play Movies & TV**

Google Play Movies & TV allows you to watch movies and TV shows purchased or rented on Google Play.



# **Maps**

#### 6.1 Wi-Fi

- Once Wi-Fi is turned on, detected Wi-Fi networks are listed.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you should contact the network carrier for details). When finished, touch CONNECT.

Data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier may count differently.

#### VPN 644

# 6.8 Sound & Vibration

You can also set some options manually for further optimization.

# 6.13 Security & Biometrics

# 6.13.1 Screen lock

Select one method such as Swipe, Pattern, PIN, or Password to unlock the screen.

#### 6.13.2 Fingerprint

Use your Fingerprint to unlock the screen or app.

Access to add fingerprint or turn on/off more options.

#### 6.13.3 Face unlock

Face unlock allows you to unlock your device with your facial data. Set it according to the on-screen steps.

Ensure that you are facing the phone screen when using face recognition.

Use Date & time settings to customize your preferences for how date and time are displayed.
